2016 has shown so much growth over the past quarter. As advertised, sophomore year has been exactly like freshman year and scholars are rising to meet the bar of excellence. We've been stressing the importance of teamwork all year long and q2 making sure we are building scholars who help achieve team goals as opposed to only individual goals. 3 advisories have really stepped up and shown how well they do this. The ladies of Claremont McKenna and the Loyola Ladypack both had GPAs above 2.5, which will qualify for them automatic scholarships for college when they graduate. The gentlemen of the Alabama advisory showed how much they want to reach the goal by having 95% attendance during quarter (among the highest in the school!). Interim assessment data shows a lot of scholars have grown but that we have a lot of work to still get done. Help you scholar by reminding them to do their homework every night - they almost always have homework from all of their teachers - and make sure they get to school every single day on time. Every minute counts.

Class of 2015 – Mr. Bogard

It's hard to believe that our scholars are already halfway through their junior year! Junior year is the most important one so far; it's the grade colleges will be weighting most heavily when looking at grades and letters of recommendation. But it also marks the start of their efforts in earning the highest possible ACT score. This is the test that will open opportunities for admission into dream colleges and lots of financial support.

There are three numbers for you to know...

18: Scholars need an 18 on the English section of the test to gain admission into a 4-year university in Louisiana.

19: Similarly, scholars need a 19 on the MATH section to be accepted to a 4-year university.

20: If a scholar has a 2.5 GPA, a 20+ score on the ACT will mean tuition paid in full at any public university in the state.

Please make sure your child is constantly practicing ACT problems in his/her weakest subjects--as well as pushing his/her GPA up--every week.

Class of 2014 – Mr. Sherman

The second quarter was a great one for the Class of 2014. The highlight of the quarter was the seniors' presentations for their Seminar in Innovation and Change class. The seniors spent months working in teams conducting research on how to solve problems in New Orleans' juvenile justice system, and then presented their projects to a panel of experts in the field and a large audience. The result was truly impressive. It made me proud to be lucky enough to teach such incredible young men and women. The focus for 2014 going forward is "Getting ready for Game Day [the first day of college]." While our scholars have come so far in their career at Sci, there is still much left to do. In particular, we're focusing on raising scholars' scores on the ACT. Scholars need to get an 18 in the English section of the ACT and a 19 on the Math section in order to admitted to a four-year college in Louisiana. Earning a 20 composite score will allow them to go to a public college in Louisiana for free. If your child has not yet hit that those scores (the 18-19-20), then ask them what they are doing to lift their scores. These scores are essential for their college future. We will be offering a significant amount of test preparation to get scholars ready for the March ACT, but they need to be working on their own to hit those important scores!
